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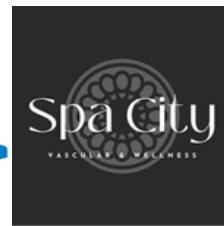

By integrating with SHARE HIE from day one, Pinnacle Gastroenterology has equipped its providers with real-time access to a comprehensive patient record. This is especially critical in gastroenterology, where patients often have complex conditions requiring coordination between primary care providers, hospitals, labs, and other specialists. Through SHARE, Pinnacle clinicians can access critical clinical data that supports more informed decision-making and improves care delivery.

Through SHARE HIE, Pinnacle Gastroenterology can access:

- Hospital admissions, discharges, and emergency department visits
- Laboratory and diagnostic imaging results
- Medication Histories and clinical documentation

Pinnacle Gastroenterology also places a strong emphasis on collaboration with its referral partners across Arkansas. Participation in SHARE enhances these relationships by enabling more efficient, bidirectional exchange of information.

Referring providers benefit from improved visibility into specialty care, while Pinnacle providers gain valuable clinical context prior to patient visits, resulting in better coordinated and more efficient care.

This connectivity strengthens referral partnerships by:

- Providing pre-visit insight into patient history
- Supporting timely sharing of procedure results
- Reducing administrative burden and duplicate testing

In addition to improving clinical workflows, integration with SHARE positions Pinnacle Gastroenterology for success under the Merit-based Incentive Payment System (MIPS) and other value-based care programs.

Success Story

SHARE HIE & Partners Honored with the 2026 KLAS Points of Light Award

SHARE, the State Health Alliance for Records Exchange, together with Western Arkansas Counseling and Guidance Center, Arkansas Total Care, and Centauri Health Solutions, has been selected as a 2026 KLAS Points of Light Award recipient—one of the most distinguished recognitions in healthcare interoperability and collaborative innovation.

The Points of Light Award is known for honoring only the highest-impact, real-world partnerships that demonstrate measurable improvement in patient outcomes, operational efficiency, and cross-organizational alignment. This year's recognition places Arkansas among a nationally elite group of innovators advancing the future of connected care.

"Western Arkansas Counseling and Guidance Center significantly improved post-discharge follow-up performance," the case study notes, underscoring the transformative impact of the collaboration.

KLAS selected SHARE and its partners for their work showcased in Points of Light Case Study 13, which documents how the organizations overcame long-standing fragmentation in behavioral health data exchange.

The award highlights:

- A statewide interoperability model built on SHARE's real-time ADT and CCD exchange
- A pioneering behavioral health value-based care framework
- Curated, payer-ready clinical data that eliminated manual reporting burdens
- Integrated workflows enabling 24–48-hour post-discharge follow-up
- A measurable rise in the behavioral health HEDIS chapter rate from 2.82 to 3.5

These achievements demonstrate how mission-aligned partners can elevate care for high-risk populations through interoperability excellence.
